Reading

In case you missed the previous advice,

studies show that reading for pleasure makes a big difference to children's educational performance. Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day, develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures. Children are then able to transfer this into their own writing.

Learning to read is about listening and understanding; as much as reading what is printed on the page. Through hearing stories, children are exposed to a wide range of words. This helps them build their own vocabulary and improve their understanding of what they read and hear.

Even if your child doesn't understand every word, they will hear new sounds, words and phrases which they can then try out for themselves.

As your children start to learn to read at school therefore, you can play an important role in helping to keep them interested in books. Find out what interests them and then help them to find books that they find engaging and fun. Please also spend time together reading the books they bring home from school.
