News from the classes

Class 1

Reception children had a visitor from Bucks County Council Team who came to talk to the children and look at the provision that we offer our Nursery and Reception children. He was exceptionally impressed with how well they have settled and the independent work that they have produced through independent play. Imbedding and developing academic and social, emotional and behavioural skills is essential to the development of a well-rounded individual. BCCT confirmed that this was very evident in the opportunities and provision provided by Mrs Woolfson.

Class 2

The children have been exploring 'The Owl and The Pussycat' by Edward Lear. This week they have been using the poem's format to create their own clever verses. We look forward to reading them when complete. The children have also teamed up with Class 1 and are busily working on this year's nativity which is called 'The Easy Cheesy Nativity'!

Class 3

This week pupils have been working on their innovated stories, based on Pie Corbett's story of The Papaya that Spoke. The class have been developing a writing toolkit comprising of adverbs, conjunctions and synonyms; both for the word "said" and for the "Power of 3" (using 3 adjectives). This toolkit will feed into the children's 'Hot Write' next Friday, which will be the final piece of writing for this unit. Mrs Alvarez cannot wait to see what the children produce!

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Class 4

Pupils had to try their best to think like an iguana, or poisonous snake!
