Addition using natural resources




Making a nest for the birds

#### WISH LIST

Compost bin - tree stumps for seating - white/cream cotton flat sheet - tarps - compost - vegetable seeds (tomato, lettuce, spring onion, radish etc.) - rope - paintbrushes - cast iron frying pan - wicker basket - trowels - plastic greenhouse-compostable seed trays

We plan to make good use of the vegetable area this year, sowing seeds that if successful we can use for cooking towards the end of the summer term and sell any surplus we may have to raise much needed funds.

We only have a small number of spare waterproofs & boots for the children to use if they forget their own, the sizes are quite small so the older children are not always dressed appropriately
