Communication

Volunteers

Medical

Any short-term medication (e.g. eye drops or antibiotics) your child needs must be taken to the school office at the start of the day where you will be asked to sign a form giving consent for us to administer the medication and stating the required dosage. If this form is not completed, we will not be able to administer medication. If your child has a condition which requires medication to be in school permanently (e.g. inhalers or epi-pens) you will need to complete a healthcare plan for your child.
