Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch a Numberblocks clip each day at: BBC or CBeebies. Use this guide here to give you ideas on what to do with your children whilst watching an episode. Maths focus for the week: More/greater/fewer/less Explore the concept of these words with your child/ren in the following ways: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gather groups of objects- which has the most/fewest? How can we check? Make some sheep for Little Bo Peep to find. Gather them up in two groups. Who has more? How many more? Counting up to 20 objects in a group. How many would we have if we add one more? One less? Practise counting on from the number in the group Practise counting back from the number in the group Add the groups together to find out how many altogether. Record in a number sentence i.e. $5 + 3 = 8$, use the objects to model this. Use snack time to help demonstrate the concept. Who has more? Problem solving: How can we check? How can we make it fair/equal? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Focus for the topic - 'Rhyme' <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to a variety of nursery rhymes: Incy-Wincy Spider: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6fwkxtp4bw Jack and Jill: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6aQ4lFic7c London Bridge is Falling Down: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=52ZLGtGhu80 Read and perform your favourite nursery rhyme. Use your toys and props to help you! <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Making a rhyming string- (see the Powerpoints attached for ideas) Read a variety of books at home. Favourites can be repeated. Hearing the patterns of language in a story will support your child's language development. If you can, choose rhyming books. Some favourite authors for rhyming books are Julia Donaldson, Dr Seuss and Janet and Allan Ahlberg.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make sentences with the Phase 2 tricky words: I, and, the, to, go, no, (Go and no are new to the children and may need teaching) Say the phase 2 phonemes (sound) and the graphemes (name of the letter) Use the phase 2 phonemes to practise segmenting and blending CVC words http://www.letters-and-sounds.com/phase-2-games.html Login to phonicsplay using the school login Username- excellent Password - excellent There are a variety of games on here to practice phase 2 phonemes. Ask your child to hide a toy and tell you where it is by breaking the word down into each unit of 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask your child to write out the tricky words they are working on at the moment on pieces of paper (see list above) and turn them into a pairs game words can you make? Incy wincy - Watch this short film together. Draw a spider and ask your child to write down something they can remember from the information in the film. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WUx2qqPUyOI Jack and Jill- Ask your child to orally rhyme words with Jill, hill, bill etc to make a rhyming string. Can they write these words? London Bridge - Build a tower and/or a bridge and label it! What have you made it from?
