OFSTED INSPECTION

News of the OFSTED inspection has been embargoed until today. The full report is now available on the OFSTED website at http://reports.ofsted.gov.uk. We are delighted that school has been judged **GOOD**.

The staff have worked tirelessly to achieve this result and the report reflects the immense improvements to school since Debbie joined us at Easter 2017 - this really is a very short time to have achieved so much. The report recognises that different areas of school are at different stages of progression but OFSTED found that pupils make good progress, we set high expectations, are ambitious for all pupils, have a broad and balanced curriculum and promote equality and diversity.

Safety

The arrangements for safeguarding are effective. This aspect of the school's work is given high priority across the school. All parents who responded to the online survey agreed that their children are happy, safe and well looked after in school... The school's work to promote pupils' personal development and welfare is good. All adults are very caring towards pupils. Pupils say they feel safe in school and that adults listen to them and take their concerns seriously. Pupils like school.

Teaching

Teaching is consistently good. This allows pupils to make good progress. Teachers know their pupils well and plan work that builds on what they already know, understand and can do. During lessons, they regularly check on pupils and move them on with their learning as soon as they are ready to do so. This helps pupils, including those who are disadvantaged or those with SEND, to make good progress in all aspects of their learning. The headteacher has recruited teachers of high calibre and created an ambitious leadership team.

Curriculum

The curriculum is broad and balanced with a wide range of activities that enrich pupils' experiences. ..The curriculum is well planned, making links between different subjects which help pupils to understand the wider context of what they are learning. The forest school provides them with good opportunities to develop their social and emotional skills.

Outcomes

Outcomes for pupils have improved since the headteacher joined the school. In 2018, there were increases in the proportion of pupils reaching the levels expected for their age in reading, writing and mathematics across the school. Pupils' attainment is improving rapidly... [Pupils] are developing good behaviours for learning, including resilience and perseverance, and this is helping them to progress more rapidly... Pupils show very positive attitudes towards learning because teachers have created a culture where pupils are not afraid to make mistakes. Frequently, teachers turn errors into learning points and so pupils understand where they went wrong and so they learn from their mistakes... School leaders positively promote equality of opportunity and ensure that all pupils have equal access to what the school provides.

Behaviour

Pupils' behaviour is good. Pupils enjoy school and this is shown in their positive attitudes both in class and when they move around the school. They feel safe in school... Pupils behave well in classrooms, the playground and when they move around the school. They get on well together regardless of background and they show respect towards staff and to each other. The school is an orderly environment and pupils respond quickly to instructions.

They are polite, kind and helpful towards staff and visitors and they demonstrate good manners.

Class 1

Children in the early years are happy and they enjoy school. They behave exceptionally well and they get along well with each other. They feel safe in school because adults provide high-quality care for them. School leaders have taken action to bring about improvement to the early years but it is still too soon to see the impact of those actions. Children have very positive attitudes towards learning and show curiosity in the world around them.

The future

The leadership team, together with skilled governors, has high expectations for itself and for pupils... The local authority and the diocese have full confidence that current leaders and governors have the capacity to improve the school further.

Thank you to everyone who responded to the inspector. Everyone connected with school will be delighted with this result and the work will continue to enable school and everyone here to achieve even more.
