STRATEGY STATEMENT

Our priorities for the pupils are as follows:

After long periods of absence due to COVID, pupils' mental health and wellbeing will be our initial priority. We will be using our Growth Mindset principles and our approach to personalized learning to settle the children during the first month. Teachers will review long term plans and, through formative assessment, quickly identify priorities within their class.

Whole school priorities are as follows:

- Specific pupils are given additional support within the classroom to enable them to access the curriculum and to settle. These children have had the longest time off and did not engage in any home learning.
- Adapt the topics to enable more practical and writing opportunities
- The overall aims of the catch-up premium strategy are:
 - o To reduce the attainment gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers
 - To raise the attainment of all pupils to close the gap created by COVID-19 school closures
