News From The Classrooms!

Nursery

A very warm welcome to the 3 new families who have joined nursery this term. All of the children have settled into nursery life extremely well and have adapted to the changes and COVID restrictions.

After the Easter half term we will have a further 2 new children joining us and we can't wait to meet them! During the first few weeks we will focus on letting the children settle into their new surroundings and making new friends.

Phonics

This term in phonics, we split into two groups, group one was focusing on sounds in the environment and group two looked at rhyming.

Maths:

Maths this term started off with number recognition and games. We then moved onto 2D shapes.

Physical development:

We do a weekly dough disco session, and have daily activities to assist fine motor development. We also went onto the playground to practice our throwing and kicking skills to develop our gross motor development.

Understanding of the world:

We have been planting lots of seeds such as cress, lettuce and tomatoes and have learnt about how to look after them. We have also been looking at the life cycle of chickens in preparation for Easter. Of course, we have explored the Easter story!

After the half term we will be starting our forest school sessions on a Tuesday morning. Please make sure your child has spare clothes and, if possible, a pair of wellies to keep at school. Class 1's Paragraph:

Class 1

What a pleasure it has been having the children in Class 1 back together again. The children have wowed us with their learning from Lockdown and shared so many wonderful tales from learning at home... well done parents!

At school, we have been busy recapping our Phase 2 and 3 phonics sounds in our small phonics groups as well as using our knowledge of these sounds to write words, captions and simple sentences. We have been learning about 'people who help us' from Police Officers to Doctors and Nurses. The children have been keen to share the jobs that their parents and carers do and how their grown-ups help others as part of their role or occupation. In mathematics, we have been powering through our understanding of the 'teen' numbers and how we can manipulate and use these numbers in different ways. As part of our PE lessons, we have been building core and trunk strength through climbing in, out, over, across and through our climbing apparatus and negotiating space through fun games linked to our topic.

We have been blown away by how quickly the children have settled back into the routines and structure of the school day after so much time out of school and are incredibly proud of each and every one of them.

Class 2

Class 2 have settled back into the daily routines extremely well since being back at school.

The children have loved the work we have done on nature sculptures. We were inspired by the work of Andy Goldsworthy to make some natural hanging sculptures from natural objects that we found during forest school. We have made a lovely display showing the mobiles we made at school and some of the work we did for art during the lockdown.











We have also been very excited to see our beans growing so fast! Each week we have measured our beans to see how tall they are. We will be finding out

what has happened in our bean experiment towards the end of the week. Will our predictions be right?

As a reward for all our hard work this term the children will be watching the film 'Jack and the Beanstalk' at the end of this week, which ties in nicely with our Science topic on plants.









Class 3

Class 3 have settled in really well since the coming back to school last week. We have had the pleasure of welcoming in 2 new pupils to our class, who have made a wonderful addition.

Class 3 have made an excellent start to their topics for the remainder of this half term.

In English, they have begun exploring 'Fantastic Mr Fox' a well-known story from the brilliant Roald Dahl. A familiar favourite to some and a new and exciting book for others. We began by looking at the characters and using the text to help us understand their personalities and appearance. We got into character by playing 'hot seat'. Children wrote down questions they wanted to ask characters from the book and a child, in role answered their questions. They had great fun!









In science we have started our unit on plants. Our first week back allowed us to have a look and explore the wonderful plants in our own playground. We combined science with art and took time to draw the plants we could see. We made careful observations and sketches.



Class 4

Class 4 have had a busy few weeks settling back into life at Cadmore. As well as recapping multiplication of 3 and 4 digit numbers by 2 digits in Maths, they've also been enjoying exploring Ancient Greece and researching Greek Gods. In English they have created their own gods Greek gods and goddesses, using narrative techniques to add to their description of their imaginative Greek deities. In Art, they've created mosaic



patterns based on patterns from Ancient Greek pottery using chalks and natural materials, and also looked at paintings by Monet; creating their own paintings based on his style of art. Finally they ended the term by rein acting the Easter story, using some great expression and acting skills. Well done Class 4!

A message for parents/carers about the COVID-19 vaccine from Buckinghamshire Council's Public Health team

There are lots of questions about the COVID-19 vaccine so we are sharing information about where you can find out more, especially about how safe and effective the current vaccines are.

At the moment the following people can get a COVID-19 vaccine and you should contact your GP to get an appointment if you are in one of the following groups:

- Anyone who is aged 50 and over
- People who work in health and social care
- People who live or work in a care home
- Anyone who is the main carer for someone at high risk from COVID-19
- People with a learning disability
- People with medical conditions meaning they're more at risk from COVID-19

All schools are in close contact with Buckinghamshire Councils' Public Health team. The team wants people to be aware of the following facts about the COVID-19 vaccine:

- The COVID-19 vaccine is safe, effective, and offers the best possible protection against COVID-19, which carries significant health risks
- Both vaccines currently in use in the UK have been through rigorous safety checks the same as all other vaccines and medicines approved for use in the UK
- Adverse reactions to the COVID-19 vaccine are extremely rare. Tens of millions of UK citizens have now had a vaccine dose and there is no evidence to suggest any link to blood clots or any other serious health condition
- The World Health Organisation advocates the use of the AstraZeneca vaccine, as does the European Medicines Agency (EMA), which has said there was 'no indication' the jab causes blood clots
- Sometimes you might see false claims about vaccine safety on social media. Please make sure that any information you read about vaccines is from a reliable source such as the NHS website
- If you need any further reassurance then please read <u>the latest response from the Medicines and Healthcare</u> <u>products Regulatory Agency</u> (MHRA) which approves all medicines for use in the UK, including the COVID-19 vaccine. You can also read more about the <u>COVID-19 vaccine on the NHS website</u>.

Please do take up the offer of your vaccine when it's your turn, as the risks presented by COVID-19 are far greater than that of any vaccine.
