PANTS

You should have received a letter telling you about an upcoming annual PSHE lesson called PANTS. On the week beginning 11th July, Reception, KS1 & KS2 will be discussing the NSPCC's Underwear Rule in our PSHE lessons.

During these discussions we will aim to teach our pupils the following important safety skills without giving explicit information or telling scary stories. We will be teaching our pupils the NSPCC's Underwear Rule, using the 'PANTS' acrostic, which is like a green cross code for staying safe from sexual abuse.

PANTS stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help



The lessons will introduce a range of ideas, all delivered in a way that's fully age appropriate. These include:

- "appropriate" and "inappropriate" touching
- your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable
- naming parts of the body
- who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried.

News from The Classrooms

In Class 1, our topic 'Under the Sea' has evoked a world of new vocabulary and fascination. Did you know you could eat a limpet? The children have continued to learn lots of new vocabulary and Makaton signs! We have been so impressed by how quickly they are learning Makaton in our poem of the week and our weekly sign. Reception and nursery have been busy making use of the new work bench and tools purchased for Forest School. Mrs Hazell couldn't believe how sensible the children were, what fantastic skills in listening and fine motor development!

This week, the children have been harvesting, cooking and eating the broad beans we planted back in the spring, they were delicious! We have peas, carrots and potatoes in the garden still to pick! Another highlight for the children this week has been making lemonade with real lemons, what a treat! In the sensory kitchen there was a big surprise on Monday as our new kitchen arrived. Many muddy potions and treats have been concocted with great enthusiasm this week! If you have any herbs to donate, we would be very grateful to receive them, thank you!





Previously in class 2 we found out about how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy. This week we have been exploring how plants grow in greenhouses, including in the biomes at the Eden Project. We then went on to follow instructions on how to make our own greenhouses using straws, plastic bags and different cartons. We will be keeping a close eye on them to see how they grow!





We have also been making some dips this week as part of our DT topic on dips and dippers. We made a Riata dip and guacamole.



In Class 3, for science, the children have been learning about Madagascar and about deforestation, conservation and the work of Gerald Durrell. Through this sequence of learning, the children have been taught to recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to plant and animals, such as the ring-

tailed lemur. The children enjoyed setting up their own practical enquiries into soil erosion and nutrient loss and reporting on their findings.











Class 4 have been busy being creative! They were joined by Mrs Cadogan from Great Marlow School who helped them to make their own unique emoji-based characters.

Some children were ambitious and created animal faces! They enjoyed creating a design, using a pattern, doing hand stitching and even using a sewing machine under careful guidance! The class enjoyed building their DT skills and developing team working skills as they helped one another with their products.

Year 6 have been writing up their memories in preparation for their End of Year assembly— we can't believe it's nearly that time already!
