The parable of The Mustard Seed. Matthew 13: 31-32

Dear Parents,

We had a recent visit from the Oxford Diocese who came for a tour of our school, met with children and looked at how we deliver RE and our vision and values. Mrs Cousins commented positively on our new two-year curriculum; noting how well the children articulated what they had been learning this term.

During her tour, Class 3 were looking at acts of kindness and respect. One child compared respect to dropping a pebble into water and getting a ripple effect. 'If you show respect to others, others will show respect to those they

meet. It's like when you throw a pebble in a pond, you get a ripple (spreading respect and kindness).'

Mrs Cousins also enjoyed viewing the lovely displays around our school that promoted our vision and values. She spent time looking at the quality work produced by each class during Black



History month. She finished her visit with meeting children from each class. It was lovely to hear the children speak fondly about Cadmore – especially from children who joined our family during lockdown.

Class 4 have started their new art project that links with their new history topic Ancient Maya.

The children not only learned about Maya masks but also created their own! Here is a little bit of history about them. Maya masks could represent positive and negative things within their culture. Masks played a central role in Maya culture and were made for a variety of occasions and purposes.

Event Maya Masks were vibrant and colourful as they represented animals' spirits. Animals were regarded to be representations of Maya spirits. Jaguars were thoughts to be associated with strong kings. It was not rare to see gorgeous and decorative Maya masks on walls of temples.

Death Maya Masks were made of the precious stone, Jade, as it symbolised the soul and was intended to protect the wearer on the journey to the afterlife. Each mask was made specifically for the wearer and was made by hand; no two death masks would ever look the same.

COVID 19
