Welcome back after the lovely warm summer & summer holidays.

This term so far has been quite wet & windy, a couple of sessions have been held in the classroom due to a wind speed in excess of 27mph or a weather forecast of lightening. (This follows our risk assessment)

Sessions continue to be a mix of curriculum linked learning (where possible), fauna & flora knowledge development & free choice learning.

So far this term, some of our sessions have looked at:

- Bat sharing knowledge & learning new facts; playing a blindfold game to mimic echolocation
- Creating mud kitchen recipes
- Woodland animal pencil sketches
- Creating 3D stick towers
- Owls sharing knowledge & learning new facts; owl & mice hide & seek
- Team games (class 4's favourite)
- Conker crafts & games

We have a very limited supply of spare boots & waterproofs so please ensure that your child has their own set labelled that can be left in the cabin in their class space.
