News from the Classroom! Class 1

It has been lovely to welcome Class 1 back to school again and see their excited faces when to be reunited with friends again. So much fun and learning is taking place from playing together. We are especially enjoying the slightly warmer days in the garden!

The children have settled back into the classroom routines well and have loved our continued theme of 'Superheroes, focusing on real life superheroes this half term. During this week, the children have been investigating the role of a Police Officer. We have been reading the book 'Cops and Robbers' by Janet and Allen Ahlberg, looking out for rhyming words and enjoying the wonderful illustrations of the villains. The children had fun making their own criminals in disguises whilst practicing cutting skills!



We have been getting green fingered too, planting potatoes and a variety of seeds. The children are eagerly watching and waiting for them to germinate!



Class 2 Class 2 children have settled back into the school routine extremely well considering the long break.

In art, we have been continuing with the topic 'nature sculptures' that we started during the lockdown. We have learnt about different kinds of nature sculptures looked at the work of Andy Goldsworthy and other environmental artists. In Forest School on Monday, some of the children made their own nature sculptures using natural objects they found in the woods.





This also ties in with our topic on plants in science. We have planted our own beans and started a bean diary. We also made up an experiment to see what plants need to grow. We planted three beans. One bean was put in a pot without any compost to see if it would grow without soil. One bean was planted in compost, but we haven't watered it, so we can see if it will survive without water. The last bean has soil and water but has been put in our cupboard to see if it will survive without sunlight. The children are very excited to find out what happens, so watch this space!

Class 3







Class 3 have settled in really well since

coming back to school last week. We have had the pleasure of welcoming 2 new pupils to our class, who have made a wonderful addition.

Class 3 have made an excellent start to their topics for the remainder of this half term. In English, they have begun exploring 'Fantastic Mr Fox' a well-known story from the brilliant Roald Dahl. A familiar favourite to some and a new and exciting book for others. We began by looking at the characters and using the text to help us understand their personalities and appearance. We got into character by playing 'hot seat'. Children wrote down questions they wanted

to ask characters from the book and a child, in role, answered their questions. They had great fun!

In science we have started our unit on plants. Our first week back allowed us to have a look and explore the wonderful plants in our own playground. We combined science with art and took time to draw the plants we could see. We made careful observations and sketches.











Class 4

Class 4 have been getting to grips with the Ancient Greeks! They have begun to write literal and figurative descriptions of their own Greek gods and goddesses, which they are all really enjoying. The children have begun researching aspects of life in Ancient Greek, and are designing and producing their own blogs. In art, they have looked at the work of Monet and creating paintings using tones and colours he explored as an Impressionist painter whilst in Forest School they will be making tiles replicating patterns used in Ancient Greek pottery. We have been exploring using mental strategies to calculate division and multiplication sums, with doubling and halving in Maths. They have had a great few weeks getting back into the school routine and enjoying seeing their friends.
