HOMEWORK

MATHS

SCIENCE and RE

We will be exploring Properties of Materials in Science. I'm aware that some work was set on this topic during lockdown. We will be conducting further experiments in class, as well as consolidating knowledge of that area. In RE we will be looking at the theme of 'Salvation' and what that means for Christians in the run up to Easter.

Year 6 children were given SAT's booklets with weekly activities to complete for homework from the start of January 2021. I am aware that some children have been doing these alongside the work provided by Mrs Groom. Can these books please be brought in so I can see how far they've progressed with the activities? Children should also still have homework books at home. Can these be brought in at the start of the week so I can see if they have done any further work?

LITERACY



Our topic this half-term is 'Ancient Greece.' We will be revising non-chronological reports, focusing on developing our knowledge of features of this text type, and then creating our own reports. There will be guided reading opportunities in class where children will develop their inference and deduction skills, as well as exploring how an author uses language to describe a different time and place as we read 'The Adventures of Odysseus.' They will then build on these key skills to develop their own narrative writing based on our theme. They will also be revising, and updating, their SPAG knowledge

HISTORY and ART

In History we will be looking at 'Who were the Ancient Greeks?' This will provide an opportunity to find out more about the culture and past of the country. In Art we will be looking at the work of Monet and his watercolours, re-creating our own work in his style. We will also use clay to make our own pots in the style of the Ancient Greeks.
