On sunny days, please apply sun cream before school and provide a sunhat.






SUMMER TERM CURRICULUM NEWS!



THIS TERM IN CLASS 2....

English

This term in English we will be reading and exploring fantastic versions of Hansel and Gretel and Rapunzel. We will then retell or write a new version of a fairy tale of our own choice. We will then use the wonderful Sand Horse by Michael Foreman. We will learn the story, retell it, use role play and then create our own versions.



We will then move on to letters. We will be practicing writing statements and asking questions to compose our own letters. After half term we will be using information books about minibeasts to identify features of information texts. We will look at sentence punctuation and structure to write some information about our favourite minibeast. We will end the year with a unit on poetry, exploring the use of rhyme, adjectives and expanded noun phrases.

Maths

We will start with a unit on place value and fractions. We will then have another look at addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. Towards the end of the term we also be learning about positional language, time and money. As well as shape and data handling.

Science

We will start with learning about how the seasons change from winter, spring to summer We will learn how to observe and describe the weather associated with these seasons. After half term we will move on to learning about different scientists and inventors.

PE

In PE we will be doing some seasonal dancing and throwing and catching skills.



PHSE

This terms focus is about diverse Britain. We will be identifying that we belong to various groups and communities and thinking how we can contribute positively, be a good neighbour and also look after the environment.



RE

We will start by thinking about 'Religions and Rituals' associated with prayer for Muslims, worship for Hindus and Holy Communion for Christians.

Geography


We will be learning about seaside environments; finding out where they are located in the United Kingdom and seaside resorts. We will use maps, aerial photographs and webcams. We will learn about the similarities and differences between seaside resorts compared to where we live as well as looking at how re-

sorts have changed over time.



History

This terms' topic for history is all about Travel and Transport. We will learn about the development of travel and transport throughout history. Alongside consolidating our understanding of chronology through using timelines and making comparisons between old and new forms of transport. We will focus on the early travel methods of the Vikings, through to the invention of cars, trains and aeroplanes. We will also looks at the significant individuals George Stephenson and the Wright brothers.



DT

For this topic we will be learning how to prepare a salad. We will be practising skills such as, peeling, zesting and cutting. We will learn key information about healthy eating and where our food comes from. We will gain some practical ideas about healthy ingredients that can be combined to make interesting and healthy foods.



ART

In art this term we are learning about the bright colours and bold brushstrokes used by the Impressionists, and other artists, when painting landscapes and cityscapes. We will be introduced to the work of Claude Monet, Vincent van Gogh, and Jean Metzinger. We will think about the similarities and differences between the work of the different artists, looking at the colours, painting styles, settings, and times of day. We will be painting, drawing, and making mosaic art inspired by these three artists.
