A warm welcome to all our new families that have joined Cadmore End School. It is lovely that you have chosen to be part of our special family.

Also, welcome back our current families. We have certainly missed you all and we are so pleased to have you back.

The children have all settled; it is as if they have never been away!

Staff have worked tirelessly over the summer preparing for your children's return. As always, the learning is personalised, to meet every child's needs; enabling them to meet their full potential.

Communication

At Cadmore End we want a partnership between home and school. An effective dialogue between both parties is the best way to facilitate this. If we have any concerns or worries over your child, we will contact you; rather than waiting until parents' evening or the termly report. Likewise, if you have anything you wish to raise with us, please feel free to do this at any time. If you wish to make an appointment at a mutually convenient time, please contact the school office via phone or email. The newsletter issued fortnightly will also keep you informed, as to what is happening in school and key dates for your diary.

Medical

Any short-term medication (e.g. eye drops or antibiotics) your child needs, must be taken to the school office at the start of the day; where you will be asked to sign a form giving consent for us to administer the medication and stating the required dosage. If this form is not completed, we will not be able to administer medication. If your child has a condition which requires medication to be in school permanently (e.g. inhalers or epi-pens) you will need to complete a healthcare plan for your child. The paperwork is available in the school office and on the school website.

Mrs Coyle

Mrs Coyle will continue to work from home for the foreseeable future until her treatment is complete. Mrs Coyle was diagnosed with Sarcoma during the summer and will start a course of radiotherapy followed by an operation in December.

At the moment, all calls are diverted to the school mobile and Mrs Coyle will be answering all emails.

Covid

With the rate of infection rising, we need to continue to be vigilant. However, entering into autumn term, it is common for children (and staff) to pick up the common cold and other seasonal ailments.

Current Government advice is that children and adults seek medical advice if you display one or more of the following symptoms

- A new persistent cough and/or high temperature
- A loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste.

If you or your child becomes unwell with the above symptoms and you are unsure, please contact your local pharmacy or GP. As a school, we are unable to make the decision but will follow the medical advice that you have received.

Leadership roles



Class 1

We are extremely pleased in how well the children have settled and are becoming familiar with our daily routine. The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring the range of activities that we have on offer each day. Class 2

In Class 2, we will be reading a variety of books written by Jill Murphy. We have started with one of our favourites – Peace At Last. The children have written character profiles and have created a book review. In the next week or so, the children will design a new sleeping place for Mr Bear!

In history, we will be learning about The Great Fire of London. We have been looking at how people, transport and homes have changed between now and then. Next week, the children will learn how the fire started! *Mrs Groom and Mrs Farrar*



Class 3

It has been so lovely to have the children back in the classroom and learning again.

So far the children have settled in well to their new class and the new routines. We have developed and efficient and fun way to wash our hands regularly and have been making a big song and dance about it.

We have begun to look at all the new topics across the curriculum. Looking at rhyming in poetry and making our own rhyming sentences.

We have revised and practiced some place value by using dienes to show the values of digits in 3-digit numbers.

We have also explored rocks, as part of our science topic. We were able to look at a range of different types of rocks. Finally we have started looking at our Stone Age topic. We have started this by giving the children a chance to ask some questions about what they would like to find out. We had a look at some Stone Age pictures and developed some questions from these.

How long ago was the Stone Age? How long did it last? Did they live in caves? How did they travel? What animals were around during the Stone Age? How did they get and cook their food? *Ms Holmes*



Class 4

It has been so lovely to see the Year 5 and 6 children back in school, safe and getting back into their routines of learning. Children regularly wash their hands, and at the start, and end of the day. It's been good to see them with labelled resources brought in from home.

We have been looking at our new topic of 'Out of Africa' this half term. So far, the children are enjoying reading 'Journey to Jo'burg', a story about 2 children who leave their home in Soweto by foot to find their 'Mma', who is working in Johannesburg. This week children wrote a diary entry as if they were one of the characters. They have shown insight and

compassion as they have followed the journey of two young children living in the Apartheid era. Children are revising, and updating, their SPAG knowledge.

In Maths, we have been focusing on revising mental arithmetic. They have also been revising times tables and mental strategies to help with rounding up numbers, addition and using subtraction to help solve calculations and looking at two step word problems.

Children have been looking at aspects of human growth in Science, and choosing the correct graph to show the matching data. They have created bar and line graphs, working on scales and deciding independently which would be the best one to show the given data.

Class 4 are a very active class, and have already begun their Forest School and PE lessons, which they have enjoyed greatly!

It's been a great start, with nominations for Head Boy and Head Girl and their deputies, School Council representative, House Captains and Buddies! We're really pleased with the enthusiasm all children have shown for their learning since coming back to school, and look forward to seeing how they progress this term.
