The parable of The Mustard Seed. Matthew 13: 31-32

Dear Parents,

What a change in weather! Last week we had beautiful warm sunshine and yesterday we had snow!

The children have been busy in their classrooms these past couple of weeks and have enjoyed some external visitors too! Whilst typing this newsletter, Classes 1 and 2 are at Windsor Castle. I hear from Mrs Croft, that they are having a fabulous time learning about Kings and Queens and the history of the castle. I look forward to sharing photos in my next newsletter.

The class that has been really busy over the past two weeks is Class 4. Premier Sports joined us last week and led morning workshops for classes 3 and 4. The children experienced a real mix of competitive sports.

As part of their English Topic 'Should we have Zoos?', Class 4 participated in a live online workshop on the protection of cats – domestic and wild.

On Monday, Class 4 had a fantastic time at Great Marlow School. There was some disappointment when this experience was cancelled back in January, but they more

than made up for it with their trip this week. They had the opportunity to make flavoured bread rolls, with a choice of fillings – cheese, garlic, sundried tomatoes, olives and parsley. They learnt about yeast and how it changes the appearance of dough once it starts to rise and about how bread making, has become easier with fast acting yeast. The children kneaded their dough and made some cinnamon rolls. After tidying up and writing an evaluation, they were able to enjoy the fruits of their labour by eating their rolls!

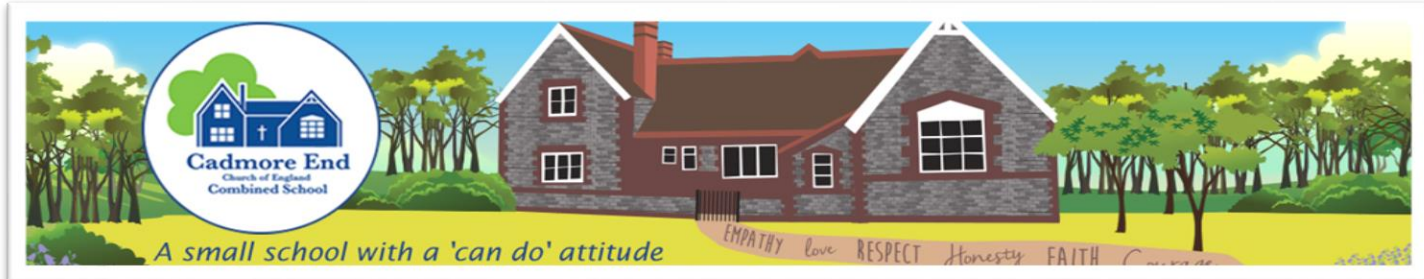

COVID Update

The DFE have released updated guidance which will take effect as of Friday 1st April:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature

- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days



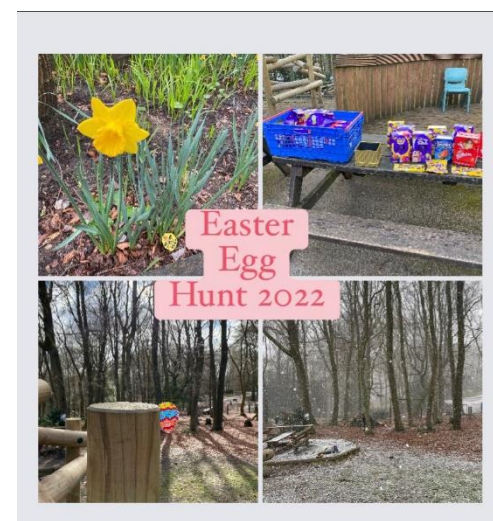
Easter Bonnet Competition and Egg Hunt
