Dear Parents,

Welcome back! I do hope you all had a lovely Christmas and that you were able to meet up with friends and family.

On behalf of myself and staff, we would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for the lovely cards and gifts.

Snow!

With the weather changing and the potential of snow, I would like to remind you how you can find out whether or not the school has been forced to close.

The school is open but there is snow and ice!

Please take care when travelling to school. Please be aware the bottom carpark entrance can become slippery which could mean you get stuck. Across the road can be tricky too. Be careful not to park too far off the track as, again, you could get stuck. If the playground is too icy and it is deemed unsafe, children will enter via the front entrance. Arrive at school at a time that is safe for you to do so. No lateness will be recorded on this day. Take your time and stay safe.

What happens when we have to close?

The decision to shut the school is never taken lightly, and I understand the disruption it causes families. If we are forced to close, the decision is made as early as possible; with 7am being the cut off. An email will be sent to you all and I would kindly ask that, if you are on the school/class WhatsApp group, that you make everyone aware of the email. You can also find out whether the school is closed by visiting Bucks CC School Closures or on the front page of Cadmore End School Website.

If the school needs to close during the day, we will send you an email and put a message on <u>Cadmore End School</u> <u>Website</u>. It is essential that if you see snow, you check to see if you have received a message! Again, if you are on the school/class WhatsApp group, that you make everyone aware of the email.

Will my child be set work?

Teachers have prepared a range of activities that have been uploaded onto our <u>school website</u>. These activities should only be completed when the school is closed! Teachers have tried to make them fun but also educational.

COVID

We have had several cases of COVID. However, at the moment, it seems that the children have not picked up the virus from within Cadmore. Please help us to keep that way by following the guidance below:

My child has tested positive - new rules on shorter isolation periods

- The 10-day self-isolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 7 days in most circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason.
- Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period.
- Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation.
- The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart.
- This also applies to children under 5, with LFD testing at parental or guardian discretion.
- If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to your education setting from day 8.
- Anyone who is unable or unwilling to take LFD tests will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation. Further information is available in the stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed COVID-19 infection.
- As a school, we will ask that parents send a photograph of day 6 and day 7 LFT tests before children return on day 8.



Someone in our house has tested positive for coronavirus, or my child has been identified by Test and Trace as a close contact: Young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend school as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Children under 5 are not being advised to take part in daily testing of close contacts. If a child under 5 is a contact of a confirmed case, they are not required to self-isolate and should not start daily testing. If they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 they should limit their contact with anyone who is at higher risk of severe illness if infected with COVID-19, and arrange to take a PCR test as soon as possible.

Symptoms

The Government have continued to state the three main symptoms as:

- new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

We will continue to send children home with these symptoms and remind you not to send children to school with these symptoms. If your child or member of your family has one or more of these symptoms they must have a PCR test – no matter how mild https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

What are we doing at school to reduce the risk?

We put more measures in place that were communicated to you before Christmas and these will continue. This includes our new CO2 monitors to help with ventilation.

You can find out about how we are reducing risk of coronavirus spreading at school in more detail by reading our risk assessment on the school website.

Please remember that all of our decisions affect everyone else. We need our staff in school and keeping healthy to keep our children in school learning. Cadmore End staff are testing regularly and following our school procedures. Staff absence cover is extremely difficult to arrange and our children cannot afford further disruption to their learning after the past two years.

Please also remember to come and go as quickly as you can when dropping off and collecting children; avoid using the school office and arrange to speak to teachers or other staff by calling or emailing wherever possible and arriving at school on time.
