Dear parents and carers,

This will be my final newsletter for this academic year. What a year it has been!

It will be sad to say goodbye to our Year 6. They were in Year 2 when I first joined and it has been a real pleasure watching them grow into independent learners. I am sure though, they will all flourish in their new schools.

It is also sad to say goodbye to Miss Holmes. She has been a real asset here at Cadmore and will be sorely missed. I know that she proved invaluable during lockdown.

September welcomes Mrs Dawkins to Reception Class and new pupils to Reception Class, Nursery Class and also across the school. We are certainly thriving with only one space remaining in our Nursery!

Monday will be our last day; finishing at 1:30pm. Class 4 parents and family members have been invited to our Year 6 leavers's assembly starting at midday. Apologies that we were unable to open this up to the rest of the school, due to COVID. I will, however, post photos on our school website.

September is a new start; with expectations across the school being raised. These past 12 weeks have been fairly relaxed, in order to enable children and families to 'breathe' after two lockdowns.

Upon return in September, we will have our Uniform, Attendance and Homework policies all in place. We will expect all pupils to wear the correct uniform and bring the correct equipment to school. We expect excellent attendance and punctuality; though recognise that COVID could still have an impact on this. We will also expect all children to participate in home learning – homework and/or daily reading. During our first week in September, to promote our children's love for learning, we will explore our 6 values - Respect, Empathy, Courage, Honesty, Faith and Love and our vision 'From small beginnings come great things' *The Parable of the Mustard Seed Matthew 13: 31-32*.

From September, we will resume our pre-COVID start and finish times. Gates will open at 8:40am with all children in school by 8:50am **AT THE LATEST**. The school gate will be closed at 9am enabling parents of younger children to have left. The gate will be attended by a member of staff.

Therefore, we encourage all parents of children in Years 2-6 to drop off at the gate and not enter the playground.

Class 1 parents will need to drop off at Class 1 door and Year 1 parents can walk their child/ren to Class 2's new outdoor play area located next to the hall.
