News from The Classrooms

Nursery have been exploring a log slice that we were given. They carefully counted its rings and it seems the tree was 45 years old! They had a great discussion on how it was blown down in the last storm.

In class 1 we are exploring a new theme called 'Under the Sea'.







There are lots of wonderful stories and songs we have shared, learning Makaton signs. These include sea, crab, clam and fish. As always, we are keen to build new vocabulary and this week has introduced words such as shoal and tentacles.

The children are so lucky to access their own outdoor area, especially during these warmer weeks! They have been busy playing and creating with loose parts (wood, guttering, tyres, crates etc), water and sand play. The Early Years garden is undergoing some developments; including a new stage area, increased loose parts and a huge delivery of gravel for our digging pit area! Look out for our new sensory kitchen which should be arriving soon!

In Class 2 we have started a new topic in geography. We have been finding out what a wonderful world we live in. The children have been locating countries, continents and oceans of the world, in relation to where we live. Some of us made globes as part of our homework this week!







We have also been learning about the 19th century British painter LS Lowry. We have found out about his life and work and where he lived. This week we made these multimedia collages in the style of the Lowry.






















In Class 3, the children have continued with their science topic 'States of Matter'. Through investigation, the children observed that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled. They measured the temperature at which these happens in degrees Celsius (°C). They also observed that different objects melted at different temperatures. This week the children will be finding out more about how water changes state, the processes that cause it to change and the temperatures at which it changes. In English, the children have continued looking at fiction and have published





some fantastic stories based on the Barnabus Project by the Fan Brothers. Next week, we will be exploring fairy tale stories.



Class 4 have been working hard so far this term!

Our theme is 'Inventors and Inventions'. We began looking at the work of Margaret Hamilton, and her computer programming skills, which were instrumental in supporting the landing of Apollo 11 on the moon in 1969. They



made a new invention using materials in Forest School and have begun looking at Roy Lichenstein and his ground breaking work as an artist.

Pupils conducted independent research into the life of British monarchs as the start of their History topic. They looked at a timeline of Queen Victoria's life and will continue by looking at key moments during her reign; whilst comparing her life to that of our current monarch.

All pupils have joined in with the Community Cops session and this week we looked at Money Sense. Pupils are learning about ways to save money and energy, as well as thinking about ways they can earn and begin to be wise about money for the future.











Class 4 residential

Class 4 spent five

days at Quinta Christian Centre with Mrs Groom, Mrs Hazell and Mrs Pattison and we had SO much fun! Due to the small group size, we were able to hire a minibus which enabled us to have the flexibility to travel around Shropshire and cross the border into Wales.

The children spent a day at Chirk Castle where they learnt about its history and the grounds upon which the castle sits. To make the most of our National Trust pass, we also visited Erddig where the children went back in time to the late 1800's. It was very much a Downton Abbey moment! Back at Quinta, the children made use of the extensive grounds and participated in archery, tree climbing, canoeing (resulting in Mrs Pattison capsizing) and low ropes. It was a superb week with lots of memories made.



Forest School

In EYFS, children have been making Father's Day keyrings from wood slices. In Class 2, pupils have made additions to and played in the pallet 'dens' and Class 3, have made their own wormery! They will be studying them closely to observe how worms mix up layers of soil. Finally, in Class 4 the children have been inventors; creating natural coat hooks for base camp.


Weather
