Weekly Maths Tasks	Weekly English Tasks Linked to the story 'Supertato.'
This week our maths focus will be on; one more, one fewer, continuing with numbers within 15 and a revision of key concepts covered so far. Monday: Begin to apply knowledge of one more and one fewer using a number line to support understanding. https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/applying- knowledge-of-one-more-and-one-fewer-part-1-c9ap2d	<b>Monday:</b> Listen to the story of Supertato read by Mrs Croft to start the week. The powerpoint of the story is also on our website so you can revisit it. <u>Task Summary:</u> To think about what makes Supertato a superhero. What are his qualities? i.e. he is strong and brave. If you were a superhero what would your super power be? What would you be called? Draw yourself as a superhero and label your drawing with adjectives to describe you. Make sure you include your name. You can do this on paper or use the template provided on our Class One Page.

What can you find in the fridge- carrots, broccoli, cucumber? What has happened to them? See the video for ideas. Role play Supertato rescuing them. Draw a picture of one of the scenes and write a sentence or a speech bubble for what the characters might say or to tell the story. See the example in the video.

#### Weekly Phonics Tasks

We are continuing with our Phase 3 phonics journey. As the children build their knowledge they should be able to read many more words. The lessons include lots of revision and opportunities for blending.

The new sounds for the week are:

Vowel digraphs: ai, ee,

(A digraph is two letters that make one sound.)

Please be aware we have missed out the 'th' sound deliberately as we will cover this in school as it is always a tricky one!

#### Monday: Recap the sounds so far and read the words.

This is an excellent video from 'Letters and Sounds' Lots of opportunities for revision of previously taught sounds too for a brush up on the first day of learning after half term.
