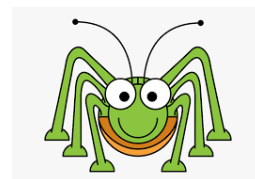


Bugs visiting KS2!

Mufti Day

We will have our first mufti on **Thursday 1st October in exchange for £1** to go towards funding enrichment activities. Your child can come to school in their own clothes, but please make sure that **footwear** is sensible.

Coats

Now that the weather is starting to change, please ensure that your child comes to school with a **named** coat. We still go outside even if it is raining!

Please make sure that all gloves and hats are also labelled!

Medication

It is preferable for medication to be given at home whenever possible. If medicines are prescribed to be taken three or more times per day, parents should ask the prescribing doctor if the administration of the medication can occur outside normal school hours. Non-prescription medication (such as cough medicines) should not be administered in school. However, in certain circumstances, analgesics can be given but in no circumstances should ibuprofen be given to under 5-year-olds.

There are two main sets of circumstances in which requests may be made to the head to deal with the administration of medicines to pupils at school:

- (a) cases of chronic illness or long-term complaints, such as asthma, diabetes or epilepsy;
- (b) cases where children recovering from a short-term illness are well enough to return to school but are receiving a course of antibiotics or other medication.



Parents or guardians requesting administration of medication should be **asked to complete the form 'Parental Request for Medication to be Administered to Pupils'**. Completion of this form safeguards staff by allowing only prescribed medication to be administered.

You can send parents to the office for a form or it can be downloaded from our [school website](#). **No medication can be given without a completed form.**

Flu Vaccination

Bucks School Nursing Immunisation Team will be offering vaccinations to all pupils in Reception, Years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 on Wednesday 9th December 2020.

A letter will be sent by BSNIT to parents which will include details of the on-line link for the consent form and school code 3 weeks prior to your flu date.

Covid

With the rate of infection rising, we need to continue to be vigilant. However, entering into autumn term, it is common for children (and staff) to pick up the common cold and other seasonal ailments.

Current Government advice is that children and adults seek medical advice if you display one or more of the following symptoms

- A new persistent cough and/or high temperature
- A loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste.

If you or your child becomes unwell with the above symptoms and you are unsure, please contact your local pharmacy or GP. As a school, we are unable to make the decision but will follow the medical advice that you have received.
